MINUTES OF THE June 11, 2015 GENERAL SESSION

1. Call to Order

Chairman Andrew J. MacKay called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m.

2. Roll Call

3. Pledge of Allegiance

Senior Deputy Attorney General David Newton led a recital of the Pledge.

4. Public Comment

Teresa Rey gave a statement regarding her interaction with Oasis Moving. Chairman MacKay stated if she had any additional information she should provide it to Enforcement staff. Eddie Hadad offered a statement with regard to the recently passed legislation concerning transportation network companies (TNC).

5. Approval of Agenda

Administrative Attorney Day requested Item 11 be removed. Approved as modified 3-0

6. Approval of the Minutes of the May 6, 2015 Agenda Meeting

Approved 3-0

7. Briefings from the Commissioners

Commissioner Assad thanked staff for their efforts in preparation of the Agenda. Commissioner Sakelhide echoed Commissioner Assad's comments. Chairman MacKay echoed both Commissioner's comments and thanked Deputy Commissioner Skibinski for her work on the recent Senate Bills.

9. Report of Legal Counsel

Senior Deputy Attorney General Newton reported the Marquez matter has been resolved, and that the litigation between ARF Corporation and NTA was dismissed.

DISCUSSION / ACTION ITEM

10. The Authority will discuss appropriate actions in response to recent legislative changes, including but not limited to: 1) changes to NRS 706.391 and NRS 706.151; 2) new statutory authority for permitting and regulation of Transportation Network Companies and their drivers; and 3) new requirements related to towing of vehicles to designated storage lots.

Chairman MacKay summarized the changes indicating Number 1 is moot as the bill was vetoed by the Governor.

Chairman MacKay summarized Number 2. He stated the 3% excise tax applies to gross revenue and the Department of Taxation will be responsible for the collection of the tax. Emergency regulations for the suggested framework for TNC applications will be voted upon and submitted to the Governor before July 1, 2015, noticing to be the same as an Agenda. Senior Deputy Attorney Newton stated permanent rulemaking cannot begin until after July 1, 2015 and detailed the rulemaking process. The Governor ultimately decides if an emergency exists.

James Kent, Esquire offered a statement with regard to the emergency status to rush regulations for TNC's. John Moran, Jr. Esquire, for Western Cab offered a statement with regard to the emergency regulations and requested the Authority take the regulation process slowly in the interest of public Tony Clark, 24/7 Limousines offered a statement with regard to funding for the additional safety. requirements put upon the Authority, concerns about current applications being put behind the TNC applications and possible TNC kellying issues and enforcement. Lou Castro, Nevada Bus and Limousine Association, questioned the workshop process. Danielle Fawcett, Personal Sedan Services questioned the driver permitting for the TNC's in the interest of a level playing field. Alan Waxler, AWG offered concerns with regard to the public safety, driver hours and requested the Authority act conservatively. Steve Thompson, UBER, and Timothy Burr, Lyft, stated their commitment to public safety is a high priority. Commissioner Sakelhide voiced the concern with hours of service. A brief discussion ensued with regard to public safety, transportation service to the public and the emergency requirements. Mike Hillerby, representing Lyft, stated the application process would necessitate the emergency regulations. A discussion ensued with regard to insurance coverage. John Griffin, Esquire, representing UBER, appeared in Reno. Kimberly Maxson-Rushton, Esquire appearing on behalf of the Livery Operators Association and SuperShuttle, offered the statement that the Authority is obligated to accept applications after July 1, 2015 but not necessarily issue a certificate and that the Authority is obligated to insure the safety of the traveling public. Kellie McKinley, Platinum Transportation offered a statement with regard to surge pricing, advertising for EDC and drivers applying to the TNC's that are currently driving with current carriers. James Kent, Esquire readdressed the emergency request. Chairman MacKay stated the legislative intent is clear, the Authority must accept applications within 30 days and that the Authority intends to propose emergency regulations to produce a framework to accept those applications. Commissioner Assad offered the statement that applications be submitted and regulations follow.

Motion to request emergency regulations approved 2-1 Commissioner Assad opposed

Number 3: Effective October 1, 2015 the changes to the designated storage lot bill are as follows: prohibits the tow operator from solicitation of the owner of the vehicle to take the vehicle to another location, the penalties are: the first offense \$5000, second is \$10,000, third \$15,000, and the fourth offense \$20,000 (in a 24 month period.) The tow operator is to make a good faith effort to determine who the insured is and the registered owner can direct vehicle to be sent to another location as long as the prescribed form is utilized. This applies to operators in Clark County. Chairman MacKay is to be the hearing officer.
