Michael Baumbach on behalf of Milne Towing appeared in Reno. He detailed his reasoning for the fee for the abandoned vehicle and the history of abandoned vehicles in the area. Annie Rees on behalf of Alliance Commercial Real Estates Management Services discussed her theory on the increase of abandoned vehicles in the area due to the increase of homeless in this area. Chairman Gibbons, Commissioner Assad and Commissioner Newton raised questions regarding the abandoned vehicles and their removal. A lengthy discussion ensued. The Nevada legislation is currently working to resolve the abandoned vehicle issue.
