MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 26, 2026, GENERAL SESSION

1. Call to Order

Chairman Vaughn Hartung called the Meeting to order at 9:30 am PST.

Paul Servello led the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. Public Comment

Sebastian Azulay of Muscle Movers LV commented on the increased presence of non-certificated carriers providing household goods moving services, urging the Authority to increase enforcement against those non-certificated carriers. He expressed concern about the inability of certificated carriers to match the prices of these non-certificated carriers and how that will affect certificated carriers.

Chairman Vaughn Hartung asked Chief of Enforcement Dominic Del Padre to follow up with Mr. Azulay.

Tom Dadon of Triple 7 Movers reiterated the points made by Mr. Azulay in his public comment. Mr. Dadon expressed that within the last year there has been a proliferation of non-certificated moving companies and enforcement has not kept up with the influx.

Chairman Vaughn Hartung asked Chief of Enforcement Dominic Del Padre to follow up with Mr. Dadon as well.

Commissioner Teti clarified with Attorney Maxson-Rushton that in lieu of the requested control-assistance fee, the fee would remain at the previously approved \$4.00 per charter.

Applications Manager Liz Babcock noted that the Agenda item should read “32 non-consent carriers,” rather than “33 non-consent carriers,” with the removal of item h, Vegas Heavy Haul Inc. d/b/a Big Valley Towing – CPCN 7238.

Applications Manager Babcock explained the purpose of this Agenda item and the procedural history of the item. She explained that she was waiting for a letter from the applicant indicating that all parties to the contract assent to changes and are working on a revised contract. She explained that she would be comfortable with a March 1 start-date for the rate increase if the NTA receives that letter prior to that date.

Chairman Vaughn Hartung explained that he would be comfortable with granting a conditional approval that is dated March 1 or the date on which the letter is received by the Authority, whichever comes later. No retroactive approval would be granted.

Administrative Attorney Yoneet Wilburn confirmed with Applications Manager Babcock that it seemed to be the case that all parties to the contract agree with the modifications and the Authority was simply waiting for paperwork to confirm that position, rather than there being a material issue which would impact the parties’ willingness to assent to the changes.

Applications Manager Babcock pointed out that compliance orders granted to companies' applying for a CPCN state that if the company is found to be violating the applicable laws, the application may be dismissed unless the Authority orders otherwise.

Commissioner Louis V. Csoka suggested that perhaps an Order to Show Cause would be a better way to handle this item, but acknowledged this item was not agendaized in that manner.

Administrative Attorney Yoneet Wilburn expressed that the Petition for Reconsideration on the application for a CPCN allows for an Order to Show Cause to be issued.

Chairman Vaughn Hartung expressed reticence to issue an Order to Show Cause without more information being presented first.

Commissioner Csoka further explained his reasoning for his suggestion to issue an Order to Show Cause; if Staff's Petition for Reconsideration is granted, the applicant would be reverted back to the application phase and they would have the burden of proving they are suitable to be certificated. Alternatively, if an Order to Show Cause is issued, the previous approval would not need to be fully revoked, but instead the applicant would have to explain why the certificate should not be revoked under these circumstances. He would prefer to have the opportunity to hold an evidentiary hearing to gather more detail than that was provided in the background materials.

Applications Manager Babcock explained that the applicant was still in the compliance phase and had not yet received their certificate.

Commissioner Adam Teti expressed that he would prefer to have the applicant come before the Authority and explain why the Deputy Commissioner should not exercise his authority to dismiss the application.

PETITION TO DEVIATE

92. **Docket 26-01013** Petition to Deviate from NTA policy by Badly Scattered Land and Cattle Company d/b/a Medic Coach Service CPCN 2413, Sub 3. – **FOR POSSIBLE ACTION**

Applications Manager Liz Babcock explained that she had learned that the applicant had stopped operations while they were in the process of applying for a sale and transfer, which NTA policy typically does not allow due to the effect on the seller's market.

Robert Templeton of Badly Scattered Land and Cattle Company explained that they are currently in negotiations with a company in Las Vegas for the sale and transfer of the company, and they would like the deviation from NTA policy so they can continue those negotiations.

Administrative Attorney Yoneet Wilburn explained that there have been prior instances where the NTA has deviated from policy to allow a company on a temporary discontinuance to sell to a buyer who is active and in business. Administrative Attorney Wilburn acknowledged that this could bring up concerns about the seller's market, but felt that in this instance, that concern was lessened due to the seller having been in the market for 40 years.

Stephanie Templeton of Badly Scattered Land and Cattle Company also indicated that the company was one of two companies with an unrestricted common carrier certificate in the city, which also provides value to a prospective buyer.

Chairman Vaughn Hartung clarified that this would only be a deviation from policy and not the NAC. Chairman Hartung further expressed that he found the request to be credible and he would be supportive of the Petition to Deviate in this instance.

Ms. Templeton asked to clarify the timeframe that the Authority would allow for the negotiations of the sale and transfer to continue. She expressed that she felt 6 months would allow for a deal to get done.

Commissioner Louis V. Csoka expressed that he would be comfortable pushing that to 9 months in order to relieve any potential pressure on the Petitioner in a negotiation setting. He suggested bringing the item back for a status-check following the 9-month period.

Chairman Vaughn Hartung indicated he would additionally like the Petitioner to update Staff on the status of negotiations every 3 months.
